The Rector writes....

My dear Parishioners

In my previous parish there was a long tradition of having photographs of previous Rectors hanging in the Church Vestry. Affectionately known as 'The Rogue's Gallery', it represented the church's ancestry list of past Incumbents.

Today's Christians everywhere, lay and ordained, are spiritual descendants of those who in times past, often at great cost, witnessed to the faith. For example, in June we remember: Barnabas (11th), John the Baptist (24th), Peter and Paul (29th).

Barnabas was "a good man". Thoughtful, compassionate, generous and caring, he was "full of the Holy Spirit and of faith".

John the Baptist was a prophetic character with an uncompromising message: "be prepared for the Lord". People turned to John, but he had the humility to point them away from himself towards the Lord.

Peter was the rock, the key, on whom Jesus relied. But, just like us, he often let his Lord down. Peter was also a reconciler: he held together the traditional views of the earliest leader of the new church in Jerusalem (James, Jesus's brother) and the revolutionary missionary zeal of the apostle Paul.

Peter and Paul are often celebrated jointly. Paul was a tireless visitor, founding new churches, supporting fledgling ones, and engaging with people who had no allegiance to Christ.

Maybe June's saints are a hint of the "spiritual DNA" we should hope and pray to find in ourselves who belong to these Parishes of Annahilt and Magherahamlet: people who know personally the power of God's presence, and who have prayerful and pastoral hearts; and are committed to getting alongside the whole community amongst whom they live. Of course, like Peter and all of us, we will make mistakes; but will also be blessed by being welcoming and loving Christians at our respective Churches. Through Word and Sacrament, may we know Christ better and make Him better known. May we hold before us the vision of that ultimate spiritual mix - of being Christ-like in all that we are and do. We can't alter our ancestors' physical DNA; but we can, Rector and People together, change our spiritual genes for the better. As another June saint, Richard of Chichester (16th), prayed long ago to our Lord: "May we know Thee more clearly, love Thee more dearly, and follow Thee more nearly". Let us strive to do that – day by day. I take this opportunity to wish those who have been or are doing examinations well in their tasks. Some have been preparing for important examinations in schools and universities. Some are preparing to finish schools and move from primary to second level education and others are anticipating the transition from second to third level. We wish all our parishioners well in their educational endeavours.

The summer holiday period looms large. Whether 'at home' or away, I wish you all a refreshing, relaxing and enjoyable break from routine.

CELEBRATING THE CORONATION

The beginning of May saw the amazing spectacle of the Coronation of King Charles III, the first British monarch crowned in over 70 years. It marked the beginning of an additional bank holiday weekend which featured special events throughout the nation and Commonwealth.

The Service on Saturday 6 May was a wonderful mix of ancient tradition and modern additions. For many, one of the most moving moments was the greeting of the King into Westminster Abbey by a small choirboy and the reply of "I come to serve, not to be served." What a perfect and simple phrase; one for us all to keep uppermost in our lives. We keep King Charles in our prayers as he develops his new role.

On the Eve of the Coronation (Friday), Magherahamlet held a Vintage Tea Party and Fun Evening in the Parochial Hall, with delicious sandwiches, savouries and amazing cakes and traybakes contributed by parishioners. Music was by Baillies Mills Accordion Band. The Coronation Cakes were cut by Mrs Lynne Green and Mrs Jean Cherry.



The hall was very well filled. It was an evening of lovely sunshine with children taking full advantage of the weather by playing games outside. Many adults and children dressed up for the occasion The event was not only great fun but also a wonderful way to celebrate a historic event. Thanks must go to so many people – but especially to all who provided food, all who ensured the grounds looked so splendid, all who helped with the preparation and decoration of the hall, and to the Band for their wonderful music entertainment.

On the day following (Sunday) the Church Service in Magherahamlet was a celebration of Holy Communion. It was most appropriate that our worship that morning was set in the context as the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper which had featured in the Coronation Service the day before.

In the afternoon, there was a special Service of Celebration in the Church of the Ascension, Annahilt with the music led by Organist Tim Howe and Baillies Mills Accordion Band. The congregation included many visitors as well as regular worshippers from the Parish.

We were very honoured to have The Mayor, Councillor Scott Carson as well as our MP, the Rt Hon. Sir Jeffrey Donaldson both of whom read the Lessons from Holy Scripture.

At both Churches we were privileged to have as our Special Preacher, the Rt Revd the Lord Eames of Armagh who was present at the previous day's Coronation Service representing holders of the Order of Merit.



Following the Annahilt Service there was a Picnic at a marquee in the grounds of Larchfield, by kind permission of Gavin and Sarah Mackie and with the wholehearted co-operation and support of their daughters and of Gavin's parents, Leslie & Anne Mackie. Although the weather forecast hadn't been encouraging, it turned out a lovely afternoon with large numbers present who all enjoyed the beautiful Estate surroundings. Access to The Lake was specially made available to us with many taking the opportunity of walking down to see this lovely feature.



Following both Services each household was presented with a specially commissioned book of photographs and the text of the Gospel according to Saint Matthew called "Crowned King" to celebrate this unique occasion. At Larchfield people brought their own picnic but in addition were served delicious scones (with lovely jam and cream) and beautiful cupcakes generously donated by the Mackie Families.



Everyone was also given a suitably engraved souvenir pen. The children present took part in the activities provided, especially the making of crowns. The Band made their way from the Church to Larchfield and suitably entertained us.

The Rector expressed thanks to everyone who had contributed to such a memorable event. He said he had heard memories of sometime pupils at the time of the last Coronation in 1953 who walked from Anahilt Primary School to Larchfield for a Soorts Day. He was delighted that we in our day had the opportunity of making our own memories in the beautiful surroundings of Larchfield as we celebrated the Coronation of our new King.

There was much anticipation in advance of our various local celebrations of this very special event in the life of our Nation and Commonwealth, and we in Annahilt and Magherahamlet were not disappointed.

Father's Day, 18 June

On 18 June we celebrate fathers on Father's Day. Unlike Mothering Sunday, this doesn't have a distinctly Christian origin. However, it does provide an opportunity the celebrate God's fatherhood and what it means for us.

At His baptism, as Jesus came out of the water: 'heaven was opened, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on Him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, whom I love; with Him I am well pleased.' (Matthew 3:16,17).

What can we learn about Jesus' relationship with His Father, the role of fathers and our relationship with God?

The Father's presence

When Jesus was baptized, the Father made His presence real by the Holy Spirit. It's the Spirit who enables us to call God 'Daddy' (Abba, Galatians 4:6). God is with us and knows our joys and sorrows, fears and trials. In this way, Dads can relate to their children.

The Father's love

The Father described His Son as 'beloved', who like us, is subject to His unconditional love. Dads should be constant in assuring their children of their love.

The Father's pleasure

The Father tells Jesus that He is 'well pleased' with Him. We also need to hear this, if we feel that we are disappointing God or letting Him down. Fathers should use every opportunity to demonstrate their pleasure in their children, especially when things go wrong.



A Prayer for Children

Loving God, your Son told his disciples to become like little children. Lead us to work for the welfare and protection of all young people. May we respect their dignity that they may flourish in life, following the example of the same Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.
