The Rector writes....

My dear parishioners

We are really pleased to report that the Sunday Schools in both Annahilt and Magherahamlet resumed face to face meetings as planned last month and will continue in October. The Rainbow Guides in Annahilt are also meeting again. In due course we hope to announce plans to resume some of our

other regular and occasional parish activities. However, we need to look further at how to return to meeting in person safely. These processes are not without their complexity and I want to thank, on all our behalf, our dedicated leaders and volunteers who are working in partnership with the Health and Safety Officers and the Select Vestries in both Parishes to see if we can make these important activities happen again. In making preparations and any further plans for resuming face-to-face parochial activities we want to reassure you that the safety of parishioners is our paramount concern.

As the regulations have continued to change there have been new risk assessments in the Churches as measures have been put in place to allow for a gradual increase in numbers allowed to assemble at services. While these are really exciting and positive developments, we are also aware of the high infection rates at present. In order to keep ourselves and others safe, we ask you to continue to wear a face mask, to wash your hands and keep your distance as we gather together. I want to thank our Churchwardens, Health & Safety Officers and others for the way in which they have worked so hard and cheerfully to keep us all safe over this past 6 months since the buildings reopened after the last lockdown. The Mothers' Union in both Parishes, the Indoor Bowling Club in Annahilt and the Badminton Club in Magherahamlet have also been exploring how best to approach their return. All these important discussions take time as we try to consult with people and see how they feel about returning. While we are doing all in our power to re-open we ask for your prayers and we recognise the ongoing challenges of the current situation.

Circumstances are constantly changing and we are doing our best to respond to these and put in place the best measures we can to keep all our parishioners safe. There is also the recognition that many people remain cautious and may not yet feel ready to return to such activities at the present time. Throughout this difficult season we have sought to be as open and transparent as we possibly can. We will continue to be so and communicate any information we have about the developing situation. May I ask you to pray for all schools and teachers and pupils as they work their way through this term? It would be wonderful for students at primary, secondary and third level to get through this year without disruption.

Can we please remember also to stay in touch by phone or cards with those who live alone or have moved into nursing homes or sheltered accommodation?

One of the great strengths of this Group of Parishes is how people have supported one another. As we have seen the value of this in the past couple of years, let us continue to build upon that into the future.

Reflections on Harvest Time in Annahilt

In Annahilt we gave thanks for the blessings of Harvest on Sunday 26 September. Although summer weather was 'mixed' with a somewhat inclement August, this year's harvest yields were bountiful. Notwithstanding the very unusual circumstances of celebrating harvest in the midst of a global coronavirus pandemic, there was a very evident twin theme of celebration and thanksgiving throughout each of the services.

There were beautiful displays of flowers, along with some fruit and vegetables. As there would have been difficulties this year distributing fresh harvest produce afterwards, parishioners were instead encouraged to give non-perishable food items which were later donated to the Foodbank.



There was a lovely atmosphere of worship on Sunday. In the morning, a Celebration of the Holy Communion was presided over by the visiting Preacher, the Rt Revd Alan Harper, former Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland, assisted by the Rector, Canon Robert Howard. The special music featured a solo 'All things bright and beautiful', sung by Mrs Hailey Howe, There was also a sung version of the Lord's Prayer and a musical setting of the 'Gloria in excelsis'.

In the evening, a Service of Evening Prayer was conducted by the Rector. The special preacher on this occasion was Canon Norman Porteus, Rector of Derryloran (Cookstown). 'Let all creation dance' was sung as a solo anthem.

At the conclusion of each Service the Rector thanked all those who had provided gifts and those who assisted with the decoration of the church. He expressed particular appreciation of the playing of our Organists, Mr Tim Howe in the morning and Mr Timothy Wilson in the evening. In addition, he expressed gratitude to the Churchwardens who co-ordinated the seating arrangements in addition to their normal duties, also to Colin Hassard for type setting the Orders of Service and to the visiting preachers.



Christian Burials 'In Christ shall all be made alive'

Cecil Wright, Dunmore Road

Following Services at home and in Magherahamlet Parish Church burial took place in adjoining Churchyard

Cecil Wright, son of Cecil and Martha was brought up in Carrowdore where he received his primary education. Later the family, including his only brother Robert, moved to Sydenham in Belfast. He continued his education at Ashfield Boys School and subsequently at the College of Technology.

Following his education Cecil's first job was as a van driver. Later he was employed in a clothing warehouse until he established his own business, a clothing factory and a shop on Castlereagh Road at John Long's Corner in Belfast. This business developed very successfully over the years and the shop is still operating. Cecil set himself high standards in business which he also expected of his employees and his suppliers. He related very well to customers and also to all associated with his neighbouring retailers 'Mission Possible', 'Quito's' Dry Cleaners and the Bible Shop.





Cecil served as a member of the Masonic Order and of the Loyal Orange Institution and the Royal Black Institution.

Cecil was devoted to Coleen, his wife. Together they raised a family of two, Amanda and Mark. When they moved to Dunmore Road they made Magherahamlet Parish Church their spiritual home. They were devoted attendees at worship. Cecil found particular spiritual refreshment in the sacrament of Holy Communion and made a point of being present on the first Sunday of the month when that took place.

Over the years, at home Cecil was a keen gardener growing various vegetables, tomato plants, chillies, garlic and some flowers. He kept up with the developing trends of horticulture by reading gardening magazines. He also enjoyed watching television, especially football.

Cecil's period of illness was a long one, which he bore with dignity and grace. To the very end he was looking forward. He, Coleen and the Rector had a very moving celebration of Holy Communion at home very recently. He thought he would progress sufficiently to return to Church for the next Communion Service. Sadly, this was not to be and he passed away peacefully at home.

We extend our deep and prayerful sympathy to Coleen, Amanda and Mark and the family circle at this time of bereavement and loss.

Dear Mothers' Union Members and Friends,

We hope that you are all keeping safe and well and have been able to get out into the fresh air to enjoy the lovely early Autumn sunshine that we have been blessed with.

At present there are no plans for us as Mothers' Union members to meet up as a group until all safety directives have been clarified. However, we may be greatly encouraged by the fact that there are many ways that we can still provide support to new and ongoing Mothers' Union projects from the comfort of our homes.

As we have mentioned in previous correspondence, June Butler, our All Ireland President, has been energetically and faithfully engaged in walking 21km in each of the twelve Diocese throughout Ireland in an effort to attract sponsorship money to fund Mums in May projects throughout All Ireland. The Mums in May Fund was established in 2012 in celebration of 125 years of Mothers' Union in Ireland and every third year this fund needs to be replenished to ensure that all Mothers' Union Projects can continue. This year, 2021, is the fourth occasion when Mothers' Union fundraising will focus on this fund. Mothers' Union Mums in May Projects reach out to all communities and families throughout Ireland to help in times of need, for example, providing vouchers for families experiencing food poverty during the Covid Pandemic, providing school books and uniforms for struggling families and clothing and food for those forced to leave their home due to domestic violence. Short breaks have also been arranged for families facing adversity. Any donations that you wish to make to the Mums in May Fund will be very much appreciated and arrangements can be made to collect your kind gift if you wish.

In a recent zoom meeting with Trustees of Down and Dromore Diocese, our Diocesan President Roberta indicated that she thought it was best to wait until the end of October to hear what Covid restrictions would be in place at that stage before deciding if arrangements could go ahead to support the 16 Days of Activism Campaign against Gender Violence - More about that next month.

Throughout the summer Mothers' Union members and friends from both

Magherahamlet and Annahilt have been busy preparing and delivering knitted baby items for use in the Baby Basics Project and also providing filled soap bags for use in emergency admissions to hospitals and Women's Aid centres. Many thanks to everyone for all your hard work, love and generosity.
